Diocesan Planning

As I shared last weekend at mass, the Diocese of St. Cloud has entered into a process of planning that involves how parishes will be ministered by priests. Bishop Kettler will retire in three years and he wants to use this time to prepare and implement a plan.

This coming Thursday, November 16 both parishes will send Parish, Finance and Liturgy leadership plus parish secretaries and myself, to a planning meeting at Sauk Center. There will be similar leadership for all the parishes in the Sauk Center Deanery. In preparation for the meeting we were given some questions to study and be ready to share. Below are the questions.

What does it mean to have "quality" parish life?

What resource does a parish need to have for it to have a quality of parish life?

How can we sustain 131 parishes in three years with a projected 57 priest under the age of 70 available for parish ministry?

How can we maintain a priest presence in all 16 counties of the Diocese? What makes your parish unique / special?

As you can see these are no quick or simple answers to their question. I ask you share with parish leadership your thoughts. This is a time of transition for the world and the church. We as believers know the Jesus promised to be with us in good and bad times, till the end of the world. Our faith in God gives us hope and courage. Please pray for guidance and wisdom for Bishop Kettler, parish leadership, staff and myself.
