

# A NOTE FROM FR. GREG MILLER, O.S.B.

# Listen, Here, Now – Prepare the way!

I listened to a talk by Fr. Greg Boyle SJ this past week on the radio. Fr. Boyle is head of Homeboys Industries in Los Angeles, CA where he works with former gang members and where they learn new life skills. It is a great a ministry to those on the fringe of society. It is also very challenging and stressful. He was asked how he uses prayer to manage it all. He shared that he uses different phrases in his meditation and then repeats it throughout the day. The phrase he is using now is, "Listen, Here, Now". It helps him to be grounded in the moment and not worry about the past or the future. It is a challenge when he meditates, to calm himself. So, he uses this phrase to better focus his prayer, so he can better listen to what God has to say to him. Then throughout the day he will repeat the phrase to himself, especially when he is going to meet someone. Repeating the phrase teaches him to listen first and to give full attention to the person in front of

I have started to use this form of phrase meditation and have found it helpful. During Advent we are called by God to prepare the way of the Lord. With all the distractions of our culture, it can be difficult to calm ourselves and really listen to God. I suggest that this phrase meditation can be helpful in gaining focus in our lives. As we wait in joyful hope for the coming of the Lord, let's Listen, Here, Now.

Together, let us prepare the way of the Lord.


