

A NOTE FROM FR. GREG MILLER, O.S.B.

Exerpt from: The Living Word Leading RCIA Dismissals Year B

"How Do Catholics Interpret Scripture?

Catholics view Scripture as God's Living Word present among us. Literary genres such as biography or history help us to understand the Bible, but they do not define the genres of literature present in the Bible. The Scriptures—Old and New Testaments together—recount God's covenantal relationship with his people from creation forward through the New Covenant Jesus made with us, which carries forward today and will exist in years to come.

Catholics look to the historical context of the work and seek to understand the original language in which the authors wrote the texts. We ask questions about the philosophical and scientific background of the texts at the time the authors penned them. We note differences in translations. Yet—and most importantly—we read Scripture as God's story of love and care for his people for us. We interpret Scripture neither literally nor as a science or history textbook. Think about the store of creation in Genesis. We first notice there are two vastly different creation accounts that we cannot reconcile scientifically or historically. Creation did not necessarily happen exactly as the passages state. Yet both accounts together teach us the truth about what God reveals to us about salvation. God created the world and all that is in it good. God created us in the divine image and likeness. We are God's good people. This means the accounts about what God has done for his people.

Though we can and do read the Bible privately, by ourselves, as Catholics we believe we always read and pray the Scripture united with the Church, with the entire communion of the faithful. Together, in communion with the Church, we discern the meaning of the Scripture for our lives and the life of the Church. We read not fundamenatlistiacally, but with a fundamental concern for how allegories, metaphors, stories, miracles, parables, struggles and adventures of God, Jesus, the Israelites, and the disciples become ours. "
