

Mystagogy – a time to reflect

The time after celebrating the Easter sacraments with our catechumen, Greg Nelson, is called a Period of Mystagogy. Mystagogy is a Greek word that is routed in the word mystery. This type of mystery is not like solving a crime but rather a mystery that we can only partly understand. God is a great mystery, our genuine response is one of awe. For the first year after his baptism, Grea is called a neophyte. A neophyte is a beginner. These Easter days are a time for Greg and us, to reflect on the great mystery of God's love for us shown in the sacraments. For over a year Greg Nelson has been studying and praying about the Catholic faith. He knows much about the faith and yet he is a beginner, his knowledge, like ours, is incomplete. These are wonderful celebrations for families and the parish. The children's enthusiasm and excitement is an inspiration for us. Going to communion for us adults can be a challenge, It can be just another routine thing we do. No surprise, just the same old thing. Jesus teaches us that unless we become like children, we cannot enter the Kinadom of God. Let us be inspired by our children as we share communion this weekend. May each time we go to communion, be like the first time, full of anticipation and open to something new.

"The community of believers was of one heart and mind, and no one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they had everything in common. –Acts 4:32

In the book The Gift, author Lewis Hyde writes about how when the Puritans first arrived in America, they discovered that Native Americans had an odd view of possessions. They would offer someone a gift, say a pipe carved from stone. That person would take the gift home and keep it. But soon another friend would visit and expect the host to give him the pipe as a gift. The Native Americans viewed "gifts" as objects that would continually be given to others, constantly circulating throughout the tribe.
