A Note from Staff Member Julie Ortloff

"Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" is the question of today's Gospel. Jesus answers the man, predictably, with follow the commandments. The man responds by saying that he has, and seemingly, that he is a good person. Has he really followed the commandments he professes to follow? It is possible. We don't know if the man is being honest or maybe exaggerating the truth, Jesus accepts his answer at face value with compassion. "Jesus, looking at him, loved him." The attitude the man possessed of thinking he was a good person, really wasn't enough for Jesus. He told the man after all to "Go, sell what you have...then come, follow me." Imagine if, today, a wandering preacher gave you advice to give up everything you have for an unknown future. I am sure we would think this was radical advice to say the least. It is easy to fall into the trap of thinking happiness and fulfillment lie in doing what I want to do and following my own wants and desires. However, for many, this road can lead to a place of emptiness and regret. Therefore, I remind myself all the time that God created me on purpose and for a purpose. That exact purpose is truly the key to satisfaction in this world.

If we give our gifts and talents in only ways we want, we can become deaf to the multiple times that Jesus Christ calls us to give. It is easy for us to avoid any real form of sacrifice, and only give from our excess. I often pray to try to hear where I am being called to give. Our trust is no longer in the gift given but instead in the One who is calling us to give. When we order our lives in generosity and compassion, it is hard for anything to steal our joy away. It is in being generous with the things we don't have surplus of that we can find our true purpose.

What is God calling you to give to follow him? Can you give from what you have a limited supply? Can you trust that what you gain by following Christ will be much greater?
