A Note from Staff Member Meghan Stretar

This past weekend we all stood witness to the canonization of two amazing men: new Saints Pope Paul VI and Oscar Romero. While sitting and listening to Fr. Michael Peterson's homily at the Faith Formation Mass at St. John the Baptist, he posed a remarkable question: 'have any of you met a saint?' Reflecting quickly, I tentatively raised my hand. I was the only one in a room full of 100 people. This leads me into the question: what is a saint? Why was I the only one who raised my hand in response to this question?

I want to share the reason why I raised my hand. As some of you know, I have had the opportunity to travel to San Lucas Tolimán, Guatemala on four separate occasions. One of the main aspects of my trips is to learn of the country's violent history and civil war that raged from 1960-1996. Hundreds, if not thousands, of Guatemalan people were kidnapped and/or killed. Fr. Stanley Rother was an American priest from Oklahoma who served in the neighboring community of Santiago Atitlán. With the increase in violence and political pressures that were going on at the time, he was put on government hit lists. He returned to the United States for a short amount of time, but is known to have said, "the shepherd must return to his flock" – fully knowing the danger this put him in. He was killed shortly after returning, dying a martyr. The room in which he was killed is a now a chapel. Each time I am there, standing in that sacred space, I am filled with an overwhelming sense of peace and awe at the reality of what happened there.

I did not physically meet this man, yet I have stood in his presence and marveled at the stories of his gentleness and kindness. The images of "open heart, open hands, open mind" fill my mind. My challenge for this community this week is to reflect on what those three things mean. What are you doing in your daily life, actions, and interactions that embodies the actions of this modern Saint? What are you doing to be a saint to others?


