In previous years the Diocese of St. Cloud required a background check every five years and annual safe environment training. They went about the task by creating materials in house for adults while have supplement DVD or short clip screenings for young people. I would then have to keep track of who did the training via paper and submit an annual report to Tim Welch at the Diocese with all of our adults and a summary of the student training.

This year the Diocese switched to a program through Catholic Mutual (the same group who hosts our insurance) which is all online. We still require a background check every five years along with annual safe environment training. However, if we have new volunteers or parents, they must create an online account and do the three-hour training which will then trigger a background check which costs the parish \$20. While the training and background check are good for five years, they still must do the annual training put out by Catholic Mutual. Individuals who have completed a background check within the past five years must still complete the annual training. This training is for all staff, volunteers and even the pastor(s). Parish volunteers need to complete the training, and the parish is notified as they do.

It is a high priority, as staff, that we keep our young people and vulnerable adults safe, if you haven't taken the training – please do so. If you are not sure, please contact Meghan Stretar, who is our parish Safe Environment coordinator. In the wake of traaic events of abuse in our alobal Church we can prevent it by doing our part as a baptized Catholic. Link for training: https://stcloud.cmgconnect.org/
