# **Area Catholic Community (ACC) Updates**

The 2019 pastoral plan for the Diocese of Saint Cloud introduces the concept of Area Catholic Communities (ACC). The aim of this pastoral plan focuses on strengthening the life of the Church in central Minnesota. This will be accomplished through collaboration and sharing of resources, talents, and efforts within an ACC. Every parish in the Diocese will be part of an ACC compromised of two or more parishes in a region.

### Our parish of St. John the Baptist and St. Joseph Parish of St. Joseph will form an ACC.

What will happen on July 1, 2019? The formal establishment of Area Catholic Communities in the Diocese of Saint Cloud. What that will look like will be determined by local leadership in collaboration with the diocesan personnel committee. For some, it is the joining of existing clusters. For others new parish relationships may begin. Goals for relationship building, ministries, resource use, etc. will be determined by each ACC planning council.

### A Note from Jason Prigge

### Where's the fruit? Repent!

The journey of the Great 90 Days continues this week with our destination being the fig tree. What's important about our stop this week? Repent! It's a phrase we hear often during Lent, especially at Reconciliation Services but we also are challenged with the phrase at the beginning of our journey. When would have that taken place? If you guessed Ash Wednesday, you would be correct. We are signed with Ashes and upon our markings the minister says, "Repent and believe the Gospel." To repent is to have remorse or sincere regret and to amend our life from sin.

In the ancient world it was believed that bad things happened to those who did something horrible. But it was also believed that if you did aood, vour life was blessed and full. Jesus saw the events at the beginning of the Gospel differently which led him to tell the parable of the fig tree. Jesus challenges us and says if we aren't growing and bearing good fruit, we will be like the fig tree and be cut down, even if we "lead a good life." Where in your life, family, friends, work or parish is there a lack of fruit? For me I often find fruit in our young people, our liturgical ministers, our choir, etc. It is because our foundation (our soil) is rich, healthy, vibrant which helps us bear good fruit. The lack of fruit in my life

comes from our secular world; Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, politics and even parts of the Catholic Church. So as Jesus challenges us, let us repent and look for the fruit so we don't end up as a dead tree that will end up being cut down. Nobody wants that.
