A Note From Staff Member Meghan Stretar

What wonderous love is this, oh my soul?

Though Easter was a few weeks ago, I find myself still reflecting on what Jesus' death means for us. In my attempt to understand, the question that rises to the top for me is this: what does it mean to 'lay down one's life'? A few weeks ago, I was reading the letters of Dutch theologian John Henri Nouwen, when I stumbled upon the followina auote that offered me some insight:

"Jesus' invitation to 'lay down my life for others' has always meant more to me than physical martyrdom. I have always heard these words as an invitation to make my own life struggles, my doubt, my hopes, my fear and my joys, my pains and my moments of ecstasy available to others as a source of consolation and healing. To witness for Christ means to me to witness for Him what I have seen with my own eyes, heard with my own ears and touched with my own hands" (Love, Henri: Letters on the Spiritual Life, p. xii)

Naturally integrated into a discussion on authenticity, comes vulnerability, an exposure of our deepest and truest selves. Christ's ultimate display of love and deep compassion on the cross, his total and complete gift of self calls each of us to more intentional action. Christ's death is not just something we remember during the Lenten and Easter seasons.

What we do, how we do it, what we say, how we engage with others, how we attend to ourselves, our interactions with God – these are all encompassed in our souls – and allow us to more fully come to know the depth of the love Christ has for each of us. We are called, each day, to show this kind of love to others.
