Fleuroselect Approved Novelty Winner. The 3-4 in. single flowers of Apricot Lemonade cosmos range in color from soft lemon yellow to pastel apricot. Many are adorned with a blush pink central halo and pink undersides to their petals. Compact, bushy 18-26 in. tall plants are early to bloom, and continue flowering well into fall if deadheaded – They make excellent cut flowers.
