FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends in our Lord Jesus: COVID continues to regulate our lives here in the parishes. I have heard from my fellow Benedictine priests in the diocese that their mass attendance continues to be high for outdoor masses and pretty steady at about 50 to 75 for indoor services. I think that we have peaked at attendance here in Saint Joseph, so the Sunday of September 20th we will be adding a Mass at 8:30. Hopefully that will allow more of you to attend the Eucharist safely. At the deanery meeting I also learned more about the settlement of restructuring for the diocese. The diocese is presently selling properties to cover some of the monies needed to settle with the attorneys. The assessments to the parishes will be collected probably before the end of 2020. The parish participation means that in the future no further claims can be made against a participating parish. The diocese is working hard to finalize this agreement that has been in the works for several years. Once the insurance companies came to an agreement that was the last element to finally settle. I know this is painful to many of you. The diocese and all of the clergy have worked hard to insure that this abuse will not happen in the future. Also, I know the Abbey works with "Presidium" for a yearly examination of the measures that we have put in place. All of the staff, teachers, priests and deacons and anybody who works in the church take yearly "safety" training and background checks are completed regularly. The seminaries are educating future religious and priests in new ways to help everyone involved in parish life to be more aware of problem areas that could lead to abuse. I know that bishops and priests have lost credibility, but we are doing everything possible to protect the safety of everyone. You have all suffered from this abuse crisis and I thank you for continuing to worship in these communities. We need you with us. Fr. Jerome Tupa, OSB, Pastor

GOSPEL REFLECTION—SEPTEMBER 13



"The Lord is kind and merciful!"

These words from the responsorial psalm for today are a summary of the message of the Gospel. Jesus tells the story of a man who is forgiven by his master to whom he owes a great debt. But then the man refuses to forgive another person who owes a much smaller debt. This seems unfair to the other workers and so they report it to the master who then punishes the one forgiven until he pays the whole debt. What is the message for us today? Jesus challenges us to be willing to forgive and to accept the fact that others are forgiven. Have you ever judged someone who came back to the Church after committing a serious evil? Have you been willing to forgive someone who has harmed you, even when that is difficult? Jesus tells us we can never forgive too often. We can't measure the times we forgive!

This week pray for someone who needs to be forgiven! Make an effort to forgive those who have harmed you in any way!
