

GOSPEL REFLECTION—NOVEMBER 29

Today we begin the season of Advent – which means coming. It is a time of preparation for Christmas. How do we prepare for something that happened over 2000 years ago? This season is a call to each of us to connect with our own soul's longing for Christ's kingdom. It is a time for each of us to deepen our relationship with God through prayer and service.

O Lord make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved. These words from the responsorial psalm set the stage for this first Sunday of Advent. The Gospel reading form Mark reminds us as it did the disciples to "Be watchful! Be alert!" These words are reminding us to be prepared for Jesus coming – whenever that is! How do we prepare? Where do we see the face of Jesus? Recall the Gospel when Jesus gave us the two great commandments – love God and love your neighbor as yourself. It is the keeping of these two commandments that helps us to be prepared. We can show our love of God through, prayer and sacrifice, participation at Mass and private prayer and reflection. We show our love for our neighbor through acts of kindness and compassion for those around us. We show our love for ourselves by using the gifts that God gave us and by taking care of ourselves in body and spirit. It is in all these times that Jesus comes to us in others!


Future Masses/Reconciliation Service on Dec. 16
