

GOSPEL REFLECTION—FEBRUARY 14



"I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble and you fill me with the joy of salvation." Psalm 32

These words from the Responsorial Psalm, remind us of God's saving help. In the Gospel today, a leper comes to Jesus for healing saying, "If you wish, you can make me clean." And Jesus responds, "I do will it. Be made clean." And the leper was healed.

Leprosy was seen as a communicable disease and therefore people who had it were isolated. (It may seem a bit like the pandemic we are in now.) Leprosy was also associated with sin. As we look at our lives we can all find areas of sin, our leprosy. What are the areas from which we need healing? Is it selfishness, being uncharitable, not taking time to pray, not looking out for the good of others? This week take time to reflect on your life and ask God for healing.

This week we begin the season of Lent – a time for choosing areas of our life in which we want to improve. We take time to look at the areas of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. What resolutions will you make that will help you to deepen your relationship with God? The Lenten Calendar enclosed in the bulletin may be helpful for you as you walk through each day of Lent. STATIONS OF THE CROSS: Will be held every Friday evening of Lent at 7:00 pm in church. (starting Feb. 19) Those who attend will be given a free booklet of The Stations, which they may then keep and bring with them each time they attend.
