

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NEWS: NOVENA FOR LIFE

Greetings parish families of Saint Joseph and Saint John the Baptist Parishes

This week's article will explain one of our "Life" programs that involves all parishioners.

It is called the "Novena for Life." It's purpose is to lead your community in the spiritual fight to establish a culture of life. Knights and their families come together to promote the protection of life. The protection of life is a sustained prayer intention of the Church, and in particular of the Knights of Columbus. Knights remain firmly committed to defending the right to life of every human being - from the moment of conception to natural death. To commemorate and bolster this important cause, councils will promote a novena, nine days of sustained prayer, to build up a culture of life in our parishes, homes and wider community. You are encouraged to pray the rosary, read scripture, or other prolife prayers. A novena is a period of sustained prayer over nine days for a particular intention. Community members are encouraged to pray in their homes on each of the nine days of the novena. The particular intention of this novena is life. The protection of life is a sustained praver intention of the Catholic Church and of the Knights of Columbus. A Novena for Life is meant to bring Knights of Columbus and parish families together in a spiritual battle to lead their communities, through both public and private acts of prayer, to ensure a culture of life in our nations. We ask our Almighty Father to give us courage to proclaim the supreme dignity of all human life and demand that society itself give its protection.

GOSPEL REFLECTION—MARCH 7



"Lord, you have the words of everlasting life!" Psalm 19 The first reading for today's Mass is the proclamation of the Ten Commandments. The first three commandments, relating to our relationship with God, have a longer explanation. The other seven deal with our relationship with other people. These

commandments were delivered within the context of God entering into a covenant relationship with the people of Israel. They also show a relationship between us and God.

Recall the Ten Commandments as you memorized them. The first tells us there is only one God that we should worship, the second calls us to respect the name of God and the third reminds us to keep holy the Lord's Day.

How do these apply to our daily life? In the first commandment God must be most important in our lives. He cannot be replaced by riches, possessions, or bad habits. In keeping the second commandment we do not use the name of God in fun or in swearing. Sometimes use of the name of Jesus can become a bad habit. Keep holy the Lord's Day reminds us to use our Sunday in a special way – extra prayer, family time and less work.

The next seven commandments demand respect for others, their bodies, and their belongings.

Take time this week to reflect on these commandments and how they are lived out in your daily life.
