



GOSPEL REFLECTION—APRIL 4



Alleluia! He is Risen!

Today we celebrate the feast of Easter. We have just journeyed through Lent and Holy Week. How things have changed. The women arrive at the tomb to find the stone rolled away. The man in white tells them that Jesus is not there. They are the first witnesses to the Resurrection.

The women report back to the apostles that Jesus was not in the tomb and they immediately went out to see for themselves. They did not understand that Jesus was to rise from the dead. Imagine you were with the women! What kind of feelings would you have? Fear, amazement, deep concern about what happened to Jesus! During this week reread the Gospel (John 20:1-9) and reflect on what this means in your life today. Jesus has risen! How will you bring the joy of the resurrection to those you meet this week?
