

GOSPEL REFLECTION—APRIL 25



Today we hear the Gospel of the Good Shepherd. This sometimes is called Good Shepherd Sunday. We are reminded that Jesus is the good shepherd who gave his life for his flock. The good shepherd knows his sheep and they know him. The shepherd leads his flock and does not drive them. Jesus says there are other sheep which he must also lead.

Jesus, like the good shepherd, knows each of us by name and he has laid down his life for us. We respond by following his commands and reaching out to others in the flock.

This week take time to read the entire story of the Good Shepherd – John 10: 1-30. Recall that Jesus knows you by name and give thanks for his gift of caring for his flock and giving his life for us. Also think of how you can reach out to others who may need encouragement and or prayers.
