GOSPEL REFLECTION—JULY 25



The hand of the Lord feeds us, he answers all our needs!

These words of the responsorial psalm are the link between the readings of this Sunday. In the first reading, Elisha, a prophet of the Old Testament, has twenty loaves of bread and

feeds the people. The people ate and there was some left over. In the Gospel Jesus had five loaves and two fish! With this he feeds the five thousand and has some left over. The fact that Jesus feeds more people with less bread shows he is a greater prophet. The people recognize this and they want to make him a king. But Jesus again went to the mountain alone. He went to pray for the strength to carry on with his ministry.

Where are we fed? We are fed each week with the words of Scripture and at the table of the Eucharist. God provides for our needs at our family table with food and other gifts we need. This week we are challenged to recognize the food that we are given in the Eucharist. How do we show our gratitude and appreciation for this gift? Prayers of praise and thanksgiving to our loving God

is one way in which we can be grateful.

However, in our daily lives, we are challenged to provide food for others. A way in which we can provide for others is to bring food or a monetary gift for the local food shelf. Have a family discussion about the commandment to "feed the hungry", and talk about how you can help!

JULIA REBER TO JOIN IN MINISTRY WORK WITH NATIONAL EVANGELIZATION TEAMS



Hello! My name is Julia Reber. I'm 18 years old, and I've been a parishioner here at Saint Joseph Church all my life. I've just graduated from high school. Today, I wanted to share with you a bit about my upcoming opportunity with NET Ministries. My personal encounter with Jesus has been a slow and gradual one. As I grow and get to know Him better, the more I feel Him present in my life. I did not have a big conversation that happened, but He has been slowly

converting my heart a little each day. He has revealed His love for me, and I have realized that because of His love for me, it is my calling to share His love to others. This is where NET comes in.

NET stands for the National Evangelization Teams and is a non-profit Catholic organization. NET shares the Gospel with youth from 6th-12th grade around the country through retreats, parish, and school ministry. It is headquartered in West St. Paul, MN and is one of the largest and most successful Catholic youth ministries around the U.S because NET team members are close in age to the youth they serve. It is composed of 18 through 28 year-olds who give a year of their time, talents and faith to the youth.

Recently I went through an interview process to serve as one of the 150 missionaries who will help reach 80,000 young people around the United States. I was accepted and confirmed my YES with them. Come August 16th, I will head out to W. St. Paul, Minnesota with my one suitcase and

backpack for the year, and I will receive training and formation for the first five weeks. After that time, NET will send out 14 teams in September that are made up of about 8-12 people on a team. Nine of the teams will be traveling from diocese to diocese to put on pre-scheduled retreats for youth, and could travel 20,000 miles or more! The other NET teams will be Discipleship Teams, which work within a Catholic parish or school to gather, engage, and lead discipleship groups for teens.

To help cover costs of training, room and board, healthcare, and transportation, each NET missionary is asked to raise a minimum of \$6,000-\$7,000 dollars in ministry partnership. The actual cost of putting each team member into active ministry for the year is over \$20,000, so team members who exceed the partnership goal are encouraged to go above and beyond. If possible, I would like to have raised the majority of my funds by the time I begin my five weektraining period in mid-August, so that I can focus all of my attention on the mission.

This is also a great opportunity for you to be a part of NET's mission in sharing the Gospel! If you feel called and are able to help support me in this mission, I will be in the back of the church after the Masses of July 31 and August 1 in Saint Joseph with envelopes and more information. You can also donate online at netusa.org/supportamissionary and list my name as the missionary you are supporting.

If you would like to know more about the ministry or if you have any questions, I would love to talk with you after Mass! Thank you all so much for giving me your time and please continue in prayer for the ministry, the youth, and myself. God Bless! Julia Reber
