## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As you read through the bulletin this weekend, you'll notice that a lot of exciting things are happening or about to happen, and most of them have to do with Evangelization. That's one area Pope Francis has been urging us to become more active in by increasing our understanding and appreciation of our Faith. But the gift of Faith is not to be hidden under a bushel basket, but rather, placed on a lampstand so that light of Faith given to us may be shared with others as well.

With prayers, blessings, distribution of materials, presentation of program plans, as well as the fruit of a summer's worth of preparation on the part of staff and volunteers, Catechetical Sunday asks God's blessing and everyone's support for these very important parts of our parish Faith Formation.

That Formation begins in the home where the child's primary teachers, the parents, instill the elements of our Faith in their children. It is essential that parents continue to support that formation as children take part in the Children's Liturgy of the Word, enter Catholic schools and take part in Faith Formation programs. That formation will be intensified as children and youth prepare for First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation. But it doesn't end there. Growing in our Faith is a lifelong process through participation in the Eucharist and its scriptural readings, faith enrichment programs, and much more. One such opportunity I would like to highlight is the enrichment program Fr. Blane and I offer following the 9 AM Mass at St. Joseph's in Heritage Hall. Last Tuesday we began a "Retreat with Pope Francis", The one-hour sessions, lasting for six weeks, each begin with a half-hour video followed by half hour of discussion. Even if one is not able to participate in the whole series, individual sessions can be of great value as well.

## GOSPEL REFLECTION—SEPTEMBER 19



Behold God is my helper; The Lord sustains my life. In the Gospel for today, Jesus is telling his disciples about his coming death and resurrection. They do not understand and just keep on with their own discussion about who is greatest. Jesus chides them for this reminding them that “if anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all!” It is natural for people to desire to be recognized for what they do. How do you like to be recognized? How do you recognize others for what they do? Often a kind word or a gesture of appreciation is all that is needed. Sometimes we take for granted the service that others do for us. Take time this week to think of those who are not appreciated for what they do! Some examples might be the bus driver, the mail man, the first responder or the cooks and servers in restaurants. Look at your family – How do you show appreciation for one another? How do you serve one another? Jesus also points out the simplicity of a little child. How do you see the “little child” in the people you meet? How do you recognize Jesus in them? This week be grateful for all those who appreciate you. Reach out to others in showing appreciation.
