### OPENING THE SYNOD—WEEKEND OF OCTOBER 17<sup>TH</sup>

This weekend, throughout the world, Pope Francis has asked all Catholics to celebrate a special Mass marking the beginning of the "Synod" process he has called for in the Church.

The "Synod" will involve all the Bishops of the world and will include dialogue with and input from the People of God in each and every Diocese. It will culminate with a gathering in Rome in 2023 where all the input that has been collected will be discussed, discerned, and prayed about, all as a means to naming the current needs of the Church and charting a vision for moving forward.

We are beginning the process of preparations for it now.

We are especially proud that one of our very own parishioners within our Area Catholic Community, Dr. Kristin Colberg, a parishioner at the Church of Saint Joseph, will serve on the theological commission charged with assisting the leaders of the Synod of Bishops' general secretariat. Dr. Colberg is a faculty member of St. John's School of Theology and Seminary. In the coming weeks and years, let us continue to pray for the success of this process and that God's will be done.

**St. Joseph:** We, the Church of Saint Joseph, are a Catholic, Benedictine faith community. Through our liturgy and faith formation, we build on a solid foundation as active witnesses of Christ, and we eagerly respond to the needs of the Parish and the global community.

**St John the Baptist:** We are a progressive Catholic Benedictine Community encountering Christ through the celebration of Word and Sacrament, one another, nature, and our thirst to create a just world.

### STAFF SHARING—MARIAN

This past weekend we began the 2021-2022 faith formation sessions. What a joy it was to have the catechetical team, parish children, youth and parents back in Heritage Hall. What



joy to have the catechetical team waiting and ready to share the richness of our Catholic faith. Having the classes in Heritage Hall worked out very well.. with grades 1-8 coming from 9:00-10:15 am, Liturgy of the Word during the 10:30 am Mass and grades 9-10-11 coming at 6:00 pm. Each of these gatherings proved to be filled with plenty of excitement and sharing.

The National Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) chose as this year's catechetical team the motto: "Say the Word and my Soul Shall be Healed." Sunday's faith formation gatherings felt like healing moments after being in "isolation" the past year because of the pandemic. The community aspect of our human existence is so important and brings healing to lonely hearts. I have shared this true story with many of you already, but it bears repeating here and is the essence of what we are called to do as a community of faith. A "thousand years ago" when I first started out as Director of Faith Formation, I asked children to carry the Christ Child in the Christmas Eve procession. I needed to stress that they would not be dressing up that year as "Mary and Joseph," but simply would carry the Christ -Child statue forward. Seemingly, I stressed this one too many times so they wouldn't be disappointed to not be in costume. All of a sudden, the one child quite frustrated with me said: "Sister, it doesn't matter what Mary wore. What matters is that she carried the Baby Jesus!" This is not only a story to be shared around Christmas time, it is a reminder for every day; we are called to carry/bring Christ to each other.
