

STAFF SHARING—MARY TURN ORDINARY TIME INTO EXTRAORDINARY TIME

The church calendar says that we are back in "Ordinary Time". But you know what? Things are far from "ordinary" for us. For many years we were fortunate to have very few changes other than the new Heritage Hall and the



renovation of our beautiful Church. Then suddenly God plays apple cart upset with us and we are still reeling. But who are we to judge? Who are we to say that we have had enough? Who are we to complain? Who are we to challenge the One who is ultimately in charge? Isaiah says: "Seek the Lord while he may be found, call him while he is near." Jane Knuth in the Lovola Press booklet adds to this quote: "We know that the Lord is always near, that God desires to be found. But Isaiah hints that there may come a time when this is not so. Our hearts can become so hardened that we no longer search for God. Our ego becomes so big that God's nearness is meaningless. We raise our voices, and God's small, quiet voice cannot be heard. We use our money, our influence, our deceptions, our weapons, and we tell God to step aside while we fix matters in our own wav."

This is utter foolishness. We know this. Sometimes we are forced to experience our helplessness. This is a good lesson for us. It helps deflate our pride. The time is now that the ordinary becomes extraordinary and so we turn to our God. We learn how to surrender once again. We do not see the way when we look forward, but we once again believe. We sit back and go to a safe place and reflect on how our Lord loves us and has shown his love time and time again. He gives it to us now in ways we do not understand, but we accept. We love once again. We know that God is always near.

GOSPEL REFLECTION—JANUARY 23



In today's Gospel we hear the beginning of the writing of Luke. He said that Jesus returned to his hometown of Nazareth and went to the temple on the Sabbath and read from the scroll the passage that said "the Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

Jesus said to them, "Today this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." Jesus was the one sent and anointed by God to bring the good news to the people. Jesus is telling us, too, that he will help us when we feel like we are blind, or when we feel bound or chained in negativity. We can remember that hope emerged for the people and for us when the Savior was born, and that God is with us always through the Spirit.

This week take time to reflect on times when you feel blind or negative and ask Jesus to help you to remember that He is with you.
