A MESSAGE FOR THANKS AND PLANNING



THANK YOU

I would like to express my gratitude to everyone who contributed in any way to make our liturgies during Holy Week and the Easter Triduum such a huge success. The number of volunteers, both those seen as well as those behind the scenes, is immense. I won't attempt to list everyone

here, but please know your help is greatly appreciated. We always put our best foot forward in the observance of these holiest days of the Church year, and this year was no exception!

Thanks to Father Ian Dommer, whose excellent presiding made for what I would consider the smoothest, most stress-free Triduum of my entire 37-year career working in liturgy! May all of us continue to enjoy the beauty of these Spring days of the Easter season, which will culminate with our celebration of the great feast of Pentecost the weekend of June 4/5.

LOOKING AHEAD—LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

Thankfully, more people are once again attending Mass, due to the lessening effects of the Covid-19 pandemic. We pray this trend continues. Our liturgical ministries are in need of some serious recruiting, though. I plan to address this with our Liturgy Committee this Fall. It will need to be a project to which we give our time and energy over the course of the next couple of years. That is, it's unrealistic to think that "one shot" at recruitment will instantly provide all the people we need. Rather, we will want to be strategic, intentional and ongoing in our inviting of people. This is actually true all the time in church life, however it's especially important now as we try to recover from the effects of the pandemic.

All of us are eager to return to normal completely. Yet, it makes little sense to try and recruit people now on the cusp of summer. By the time we might beat the bushes for new people, the vacation and cabin season will be in full swing. Training hurriedly scheduled now will understandably be forgotten by the time people return in the Fall.

Right now, we don't have enough Eucharistic Ministers to offer the cup. That is, not without scheduling the same people just about every week. This is no way to operate long term, since it runs the risk of burning out the volunteers we do have. It also isn't representative of the fact that our worship life belongs to all of us. Thus, we need more people willing to step up to help make it happen.

I will be making an effort to return to a published schedule for our liturgical ministries. This itself will be a huge step in the right direction. Of course, that means people will once again need to get used to watching the schedule...or the bulletin... for their name. For the past two years, I have personally called all the ministers needed every week. This has worked very well but is labor intensive. It's time to return to having a "schedule" and allowing people to secure their own subs when needed.

The pandemic...and time...slowly took its toll on our worship life. Patience, planning...and time...will once again be needed to return to what we knew as "normal."

Blessings on all who have helped during this most challenging and interesting time. May we move forward together with a sense of energy and renewal in our hearts by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Cost: \$16 per person, kids under 2 are free. This is a discount of \$2 - \$5 off their regular rates.

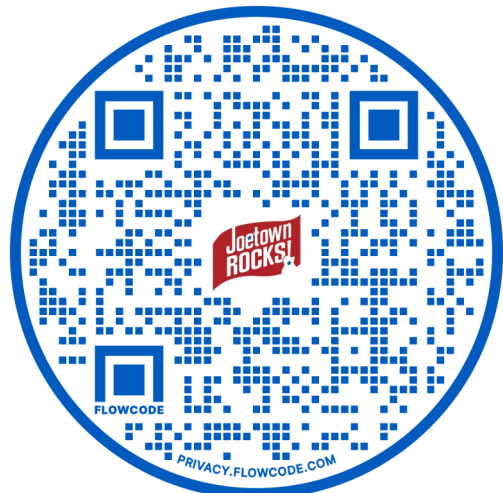
