The monks of St. John's Abbey wish to continue our 165 year commitment to serve the 11 parish communities that form a special "ring around the Abbey."



### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**—JUNE19



Today we celebrate what has been called Corpus Christi- the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. The second reading from 1 Corinthians talks about the Last Supper

and the institution of the Eucharist. The Gospel is the story of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. Both readings talk about feeding the people and feeding us.

Jesus gives to us himself in the Eucharist which we can receive each time we attend Mass. As Catholics we believe that the Eucharist is really the Body and Blood of Christ under the appearances of bread and wine. "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes." Jesus gives us the food we need for our spiritual life.

This week take time to thank Jesus for the gift of the Eucharist. Recall your first Communion and the joy of that day. Is it still a joy to receive Communion or has it become routine – something we do without thinking? When you receive Communion realize again the great gift that we have been given and give thanks to God for this Bread of Life.


