GOSPEL REFLECTION—JULY 3



In today's Gospel Jesus appoints 72 disciples and sends them out to all the villages and towns that he planned to visit. He reminds them that their work will not be easy and that

they will be rejected by some. His command is to go into the towns and find a place where they can stay and where they will have food. And they are to wish peace to those who welcome them. They are to preach the message that "the Kingdom of God is at hand," and to cure the sick. Each of us is also called to be a disciple. We are called to spread the good news of Jesus by our words and our actions. This call comes to us through our Baptism and is enhanced through Confirmation and reception of the Eucharist. How can we do this in our daily lives? By showing respect and care for others, we share with them the love that God has for each of us. We can reach out to the lonely and the sick and provide food for those who are hungry. We can pray that God will send more workers into his Kingdom, and we can pray for the courage and wisdom to use our gifts to draw others to Jesus.

This week ask Jesus to tell you what he wants you to do for the Kingdom. Do your part to make Joe Town Rocks a success and a joy for everyone.

GOSPEL REFLECTION—JULY 10



In the Gospel for today a scholar of the law asks Jesus what he needs to do to get to heaven. Jesus tells him that he must love God and love his neighbor. And

then the young man asks, "Who is my neighbor?"

Jesus tells him the story of the good Samaritan, the story of the man who was seriously beaten by robbers and left by the side of the road. Several people passed by and ignored him, but it was the Samaritan who stopped to help. He took care of him at the scene and then took him to a place where he would be taken care of and offered to pay for his care. Jesus' question to the young man was, "Who was neighbor to the injured man? And he responded the man who cared for him. Then Jesus said to him "go and do likewise".

Who is your neighbor? How do you treat them? Jesus challenges us to answer these questions and to make some practical decisions about how we treat others. What will you do for a neighbor this week? Who is the neighbor who needs your help?
