

GOSPEL REFLECTION—JULY 17



In todays Gospel, Jesus is with his friends Martha and Mary. Martha is busy about many things while Mary sits at the feet of Jesus to listen to his message. When Martha complains about

the fact that Mary is not helping her Jesus tells her that Mary has chosen the better part.

What is the message for us? There are times when it is good to be busy about many things – to do what needs to be done and to do it cheerfully. At other times it is good for us to sit at the feet of Jesus and listen to his message. This calls us to take time to just be with Jesus in prayer. Sometimes, it seems that our prayer is just a list of things we need or want for ourselves or for others, and we don't take the time to be quiet and listen to our hearts – to hear what Jesus may be saying to us.

GOSPEL REFLECTION—JULY 24



Today's Gospel has three parts. The first is Jesus responding to the disciple's request to teach them to pray. He responds by teaching them the Our Father. This version is a little different than

the one we usually pray, but it contains all the parts. This prayer comes to us very easily because we have learned it as children and have been praying it for years. As you say this prayer, take time to think about what each phrase means.

The second part tells us to be persistent in prayer. As you reflect on the words about the person asking for a loaf of bread and the friend ignores him at first and finally gives in when he will not go away. So, God challenges us to continue asking for what we need even if it seems like we get no answer.

The third part reminds us that if we ask, we will receive and if we knock the door will be opened. Jesus goes on to say, "If you then who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Take time this week to read this Gospel again – Luke 11: 1-13. What is God's message for you this week? Do you pray with meaning, and do you continue to ask even when it seems that there is no answer?
