

A LETTER FROM NET MINISTRIES MISSIONARY, CHARLES REBER



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings! My name is Charles Reber and I have been an active member of your parish for 22 years. First, I want to thank you and the parish community for providing me with such a great faith community! This parish has been a huge blessing for my faith journey! This is one of the reasons I am writing to you now.

As I am currently working as an apprentice electrician with the IBEW 292, I have been prayerfully discerning what God might be calling me to do next. After much prayer, discernment, and speaking with friends and

family members, I decided to apply for a year of service with NET Ministries for the upcoming school year. I have officially been accepted and I will be serving as a missionary with NET Ministries. NET strives each year to reach over 80,000 youth with the Gospel!

In August I will travel to Saint Paul to participate in a five-week faith-training program where I will learn how to grow in my own personal faith and effectively share it with others. Then from September to May, I will be in full-time active ministry with my assigned NET team where I will engage youth on a daily basis by helping lead retreats, giving talks, and leading small groups at Catholic parishes and schools. I am excited to get out and start sharing the Gospel with NET!

The first leg of my missionary journey has already begun as I have been building my support team of faithful ministry partners who have a passion for evangelization in the Catholic Church. In order to cover the costs of training, healthcare, and a small monthly stipend, NET Ministries has asked me to raise between \$7,000-\$8,000 in ministry partnership to cover a portion of the costs for my missionary year of service. (The actual cost for my year of service is more than three times this amount, but NET Ministries raises additional funds to support its missionaries.)

While I plan to raise much of my ministry partnership by meeting and speaking with prospective ministry partners individually, I would love for members of this parish to join me in this ministry!

You can support me by talking to me after Mass, I'll be in the back of church the weekends of July 30th-31st and August 6th-7th. You can also support me by visiting www.netusa.org/supportamissionary
I am so excited to serve on NET this following year, and am looking forward to sharing my own personal faith story as well as to being the difference between the youth of our Church from having a mediocre faith life to one on fire with the Holy Spirit!

Please keep me in your prayers this following year.

GOSPEL REFLECTION—JULY 31



"If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts."
These words from the Responsorial Psalm challenge us today to listen with our ears and with our hearts. In the

GOSPEL REFLECTION—AUGUST 7



Trust is the theme for this Sunday. The Gospel has several instructions for us. Jesus tells the disciples and us that we should not be attached to earthly possessions. What possessions do you need to get rid of

or share with others? The second part of the Gospel reminds us that we must be always prepared because we do not know when Jesus will come again. The third section talks about the proper use of authority. What is the message for us?

In the first section we are reminded to share the gifts that we have been given – our time, talents and treasure. "For where your treasure is, there will be your heart." You can share with your family, with your parish and with your community.

In the second part of the Gospel, Jesus tells a story reminding us that we must always be prepared for his coming. "You must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Look at your relationship with God. Are you taking time to pray and to ask forgiveness for sin?

In the third part Jesus talks about the proper use of authority. Do not use a position of privilege to take advantage of others. Treat others as you would like to be treated.

Ponder this week, "For where your treasure is, there also will be your heart." Where is your treasure and where is your heart?


