# **GOSPEL REFLECTION**—SEPTEMBER 18

The Gospel for today is challenging and not easy to understand. The steward, who is about to lose his position, tries to determine ways in which he can save face. He lowers the debt of several

men who owed him money. In this way he will have people to turn to when he no longer has his job. The master commends the dishonest servant for acting prudently. However, he is looking out for himself and no one else. Jesus ends the parable by saying that it is impossible to serve "two masters - either you will hate the one and love the other or you will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon." You cannot serve God and at the same time serve money. In this parable God challenges us to look at our lives. Whom or what are we serving? God or money.? Do we look out for the poor and those who are lonely or ill? Do we just think about ourselves and what is good for us? How does God fit into our daily lives? Do we take time for prayer and participation at Mass and the sacraments? This week take time to look at the ways in which you reach out to others. Take some extra time for prayer. S. ### A NOTE FROM THE FINANCE COUNCIL

The Finance Council recently discussed costs involved in maintaining St. John's Cemetery, where many of our parish members find their final resting place. But did you know that St. John's Monastic Community pays \$12,000 annually towards the upkeep and maintenance of the cemetery? Currently, our parish does not make any financial contribution toward this expense. Burving the dead is a corporal work of mercy. This act encompasses praying for the dead, including attending their funerals and visiting their graves. In the coming months, and as we approach establishing our annual parish budget, the council feels it is important to establish a way to contribute financially in some way to the maintenance and upkeep of our cemetery. We also intend to share opportunities to physically help with fall and spring maintenance and clean-up. We will continue to keep you posted as we explore methods to responsibly support the fiscal needs of our cemetery and honoring the beloved dead buried there.
