

GOSPEL REFLECTION—DECEMBER 4



The Gospel is about the ministry of John the Baptist, as he prepared the people for the coming of Christ. He was baptizing the people in the Jordan River as they admitted their sins. When the Pharisees and Sadducees come to him for baptism, he reminds them that they must produce good fruit as evidence of their re-

pentance. Every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

John goes on to tell them "I am baptizing you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. ... He will baptize you in the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand. He will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn in unquenchable fire." We too have been baptized with water and the Holy Spirit. How do we produce good fruit? How do we live out the commands of Jesus?

Believing in what we proclaim by our words and our actions challenges us to take a hard look at who we are and what God is calling us to be! What good fruit did you produce today, this week?


