CONFESSION: THE DAWN DISH SOAP OF THE SOUL

The other day I was talking to a friend studying for the priesthood, and in our conversation, we were discussing historical events of our lifetimes. In the conversation, we listed events such as 9/11, Barack Obama becoming the first African American president, and the death of the Queen. However, one of the things that my friend mentioned is the Gulf Oil Spill of 2010. This was a rather surprising inclusion in our conversation because I had frankly not thought of that as historic, but upon hearing my friend mention the damage it did to the environment. I made the concession that it was indeed historically damaging.

While we did reach this conclusion, it ultimately got me thinking about the damage of the oil on the Gulf Coast is very similar to the damage of sin. Original Sin, we are not fully free of the temptation of sin. So, throughout our life when we choose wrong and sin, we collect "oil" onto our soul and it pollutes us from being fully and truly united with God. However, while we do collect the "polluting oil" onto us when we sin. We do have a way to remove the sin, and that is confession.

When my friend and I were talking he reminded me of these TV ads which featured Dawn Dish Soap, of all things, was being used to wash the oil off impacted animals in the Gulf. While the point was to show how effective the soap was in removing grime off the animal in the ad, confession is like the same thing. When we go to confession, this is basically how God removes the oily grime from our soul. God uses His infinite mercy "spiritual Dawn Dish Soap" to remove the sins from our soul through the priest, and it returns us to a perfect union with God. Not only that, but when the priest says "I absolve you" it is not the priest who forgives us, but it is Christ forgiving us as the priest acts in the person of Christ in the confessional. I think this is one of the true gifts of the Catholic faith because so often people just think they can pray away their sins. While the idea is nice. From a psychological perspective, not hearing the words "I absolve you" can lead to so many questions of "am I truly forgiven?" Along with that, when a priest hears a confession, they are bound by penalty of automatic excommunication/removal from the priesthood to never reveal what someone confesses, and priests who I have spoken with on this topic say that it is a gift of their ministry where they do not remember a person's sins. So, this Advent, let us all try to go to confession so we can be rid of the oil of sin and cleansed by the infinite mercy of God.


CHRISTMAS CARD SALE
