

BLESSING OF THROATS

St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life. History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

GOSPEL REFLECTION—JANUARY 29



The Gospel for this Sunday is the Beatitudes. Sometimes referred to as the New Testament Commandments, they tell of God's expectations of his followers.

They present the positive actions of the Christian. Jesus says the blessed are those who are humble and lowly, the faithful who pursue justice and those who take refuge in God. Those who are blessed imitate God by being merciful to others. The blessed who mourn are those who Paul describes as "lowly and despised in the world". To these God promises comfort and consolation. Those who long for justice have pure hearts and seek the things of God. Those who seek after peace will be called the children of God. They are meek and do not return evil for evil. They are gentle and are reconcilers with God and with others.

This week read Matthew 5:1-12a. Reflect on your life. How are you blessed by God? Remember God does not mention the rich and the powerful when he talks about the blessed. We are blessed when we use the gifts that God has given us for the good of others. What gifts will you share this week?


