### SERVING AS CHRIST

*"For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve..." (Mark 10:45)*

I have a love for simplicity. That's how I especially like to ponder the life of Christ in scripture...simple, straightforward and not overly complicated. When I reflect on the life of Christ throughout scripture, I'm not looking for profound doctrines or infallible teachings. I just pay close attention to the whispers of the Lord directed to me, heart speaking to heart. And although there is much to ponder in the Gospels, I believe the invitation to serve one another, as Christ served, is essential to our lives as disciples, especially as we seek to draw closer to Christ during the Lenten Season.

Serving others as Christ served has always attracted me. I guess in some way, this is why I have a great affection for those who serve others as janitors, housekeepers and custodians, and why I can see Christ so clearly in them.

Have you ever pondered what they do? There's pretty much nothing in our daily lives that isn't impacted by the hard work of so many of these "servants" around us. They are mostly nameless and faceless people who keep restrooms clean, libraries vacuumed and school classrooms spotless and they go pretty much unheralded.

Did you ever think that scrubbing the toilet or mopping the floor could be a way to follow Christ and grow in holiness? Yes, it can! Sainthood isn't about doing great things. It's about fulfilling whatever our daily tasks are, in imitation of Christ and His servant heart.

So the next time you see a person emptying the trash cans at the mall, cleaning your place of employment, mopping school hallways or keeping our worship spaces and surrounding areas beautiful, stop and offer your appreciation. You will be acknowledging our Lord's trait of humble service in that person. (And when you do...do it with GREAT joy!)

## GOSPEL REFLECTION—MARCH 12



"If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." These words from the responsorial psalm challenge us to listen. In the first reading, the people grumble against Moses because they had no water and were thirsty. Moses goes to God and asks what to do with the people and God provides wa-

ter for them. The Gospel is the story of the Samaritan woman who Jesus asks for a drink. She chides Jesus for talking to her and he responds that he would give her living water. She recognizes Jesus as a prophet and he tells her he is the Messiah. Because of her witness to the people, many of the Samaritans began to believe in him. On Ash Wednesday we heard "return to me with your whole heart." Today we are reminded to open our hearts to Jesus so he can give us living water. During these days of Lent Jesus calls to us to open our hearts continually. When God looks into your open heart today, what spiritual thirst do you need to have filled? What gift do you need? Is it patience, kindness toward others, or is it the need for self-discipline in carrying out your Lenten resolutions. Take some time for quiet reflection each day this week.
