

Do you have a favorite prayer? Or a prayer that comes to mind regularly? For me, it's the Memorare. This prayer, The Memorare, Latin for 'remember', is a powerful prayer invoking the intercession of the Blessed Mother. Many attribute the origin of this prayer to St. Bernard of Clairvaux, a 12th century Cistercian monk. However, Fr. Claude Bernard, a 15th century French priest gets credit for popularizing it. Some also believe that he may be the creator of the Memorare. The other day, although I have the prayer memorized, I thought to myself 'I should purchase a Memorare prayer card for my wallet.' The next day, I was cleaning up my daughter's toys and found a prayer card with the image of Mary on the front and the Memorare on the back. What a surprise! Turns out, she purchased the card at the First Grade Store, and she was generous enough to give it to me. If you have not heard of this prayer, I encourage you to pray it this week.

The Memorare

Remember. O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anvone who fled to your protection, implored your help or sought your intercession, was left unaided.

Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto you, O Virgin of virgins my Mother; to you I come, before you I kneel, sinful and sorrowful: O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in your mercy hear and answer me. Amen.



GOSPEL REFLECTION—NOVEMBER 12

"My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God!"



These words from the psalm for today remind us to wait for the coming of the Lord. All of the parables these last weeks have stressed the importance of being alert and ready. In today's Gospel, the 10 virgins are waiting for the return of the bridegroom. Some of them were prepared for

the long wait by bringing extra oil for their lamps. The others were not prepared, so they were not ready and waiting when the bridegroom came. What is the meaning of this parable for us? We need to be filled with faith and hope as we await the coming of the Lord. We need to put what we believe into practice. We do not know when Christ will come, but we need to be able to recognize him when he does come; we need to recognize him in our daily life. He comes to us in the people we meet and in the events of our lives. Treat every moment as if it might be the moment of His return.

CEMETERY COMMITTEE ON THE SALE OF COLUMBARIUMS TO PARISHIONERS


At the annual meeting of the parish held on August 16, it was announced that there will be a 20% increase in the price for niches purchased in the columbarium beginning 11/16/23. What is prompting this price increase? Sometime in the future, we will need to add another columbarium. We were stunned to learn that construction costs have nearly tripled in comparison to our 2016 addition. Beyond 2023, additional increases of 10% per year will take place. If any of you in the parish have been thinking of a purchase of this nature, this window is your grand chance. Please note that price for plots in the main cemetery or the urn garden will see normal and modest increases next year.
