STAFF SHARING

BEN EPPER

"But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain." (1 Cor. 15:10)

In today's second reading, we hear the Apostle Paul write these words to the church in Corinth. These words offer a powerful reflection on our relationship with grace and humility. They bear greater weight when considering Paul's history as a persecutor of Christians and how, even in the darkest of situations, God's grace may still shine through. The Apostle Paul acknowledges that everything he has become is solely by God's grace. He doesn't boast about his own strength or achievements. Rather, he recognizes that his transformation and work in spreading the Gospel were made possible only because of God's unearned favor. This passage invites us to reflect on the idea that our own lives, talents, and successes are not solely the result of our efforts, but are deeply connected to God's grace and providence.

Twentieth-century theologian, poet, and mystic Thomas Merton, in his text "Thoughts on Solitude", claims humility "sets us free to do what is really good, by showing us our illusions and withdrawing our will from what was only an apparent good." This quote beautifully connects to the Apostle Paul's teachings on humility, which frees us from self-centered desires and allows us to seek true goodness. Paul, throughout his letters, emphasizes the importance of humility as a way of aligning oneself with God's will. Humility helps remove illusions of self-sufficiency and pride, showing us that our real purpose is to serve others and glorify God. It redirects our will toward what is eternally good, rather than what merely appears good in the moment. As we go into this week, may we embrace humility, allowing it to free us from illusions of self-sufficiency and guide us toward the true goodness of God's will. Let us live with hearts open to serving others, following Christ's example of sacrificial love and aligning our will with God's purpose.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Gospel for today, Jesus gets into Peter's boat to teach the people because the crowd was so large. Simon and his partners had been fishing all night and had caught nothing so when Jesus told him to go out into deep water and lower the nets, he was hesitant. Yet, he did what Jesus said, and they had a great catch of fish. Peter, James and John were astonished with the catch and Jesus said to Peter, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." They brought their boats to shore and left everything and followed him. This Gospel talks about Jesus' call to Peter and the others to follow him. The other two readings also talk about "call". This week take time to think about how Jesus can change your life. What is he calling you to do and be? How will you share your gifts of time, talent and treasure with others?



St. John the Baptist Sesquicentennial Reflecting on 150

Years: Excerpt from "Stones and Hills": "Thirty-four young men in the parish served in World War II. The parish prayed for them Sunday after Sunday through novena, litanies to the

saints, and special Masses. A few days before the war's end, a parishioner was killed in the Philippines. The *St. Cloud Daily Times* reported: Collegeville: T.4 Robert S. Pueringer is the first war casualty of St. John's Parish here. He was killed in action on Mindanao, Philippine Islands on June 19, 1945."

St. Andrew Kim: He was the first Korean born Catholic priest. He, along with his Christian community, spread the Catholic faith in Korea when it was forbidden. As a result, he was martyred along with 102 of his followers. He was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 1984. St. Andrew Kim is the patron saint of Korea and Korean clergy. His feast day is September 20th.
