

### It's all about love



John 4:7-8

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love.

The Bible has a lot to say about love. The word "love" is mentioned over 500 times in the Bible, with many verses that speak to love's power, importance, and beauty.

The Bible says that <u>God is love</u>, which makes the Word of God the perfect source to know what true love means and how we can love others as God loves us. Bible verses about love reveal that our world has skewed the meaning of real love, but God's Word remains the steadfast source of divine knowledge and wisdom.

There are many different types of love, including romantic love, familial love, and self-love. There are also many different ways of showing and sharing love.

It seems that during this time of year, we start to feel like winter is getting long. The holidays are over, it's been bitterly cold and maybe we start feeling the yearning for spring.

To demonstrate love, you can express affection through quality time, physical touch, acts of service, thoughtful gifts, words of affirmation, and by actively listening.

This is a good time to spread some love. Visit someone who is sick or homebound (or just maybe feeling a little lonely). A smile or a kind gesture always warms the soul (for not only the giver, but the receiver as well).

Are we taking care of our health – our mental health? Do something kind for yourself – fill up your bucket, so you're able to fill someone else's bucket.

# **Prayer & Reflection**

### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the reading of the Gospel today, we hear the Beatitudes. This can be considered Jesus' vision statement. Today we heard Luke's version which is different from Matthew's. Luke has four beatitudes and four woes whereas Matthew has eight beatitudes. This difference could come from the fact that Jesus preached in many towns and among people with different needs. Luke's approach shows how Jesus may have preached among people who needed correction whereas Matthew's was given in those places where the people needed hope. As we ponder Luke's version this week: Blessed are you who are poor, Blessed are you who are hungry, Blessed are you who weep and Blessed are you when people hate you... take time to go to Luke's gospel and reread Luke 6: 17, 20-26 and apply these to your life. Also reflect on the "woes" and how do these apply to your daily life. It is important to remember that they do not mean that people who have these things are bad, but rather that they challenge us to use our gifts in a positive way to deepen our relationship with God and in service of others.





### St. John the Baptist Sesquicentennial Reflecting on 150

**Years:** Excerpt from "Stones and Hills": "The charter parishioners in December 1875 worshipped in a one-room frame chapel which was located next to the south-wing of the present monastery. The monks

decided late in 1878 that the monastic community and the parishioners should pool their resources and talents and construct a permanent stone church. ... That stone church was begun in April 1879 and dedicated by Bishop Rupert Sidenbusch, OSB, three and a half years later. That church, now the Great Hall of St. John's University, served as the abbey-college-parish church until the present church was consecrated in 1960."

**St. Richard Wyche:** He became an orphan at a young age. Although he could have accepted the estate of his parents, he chose to give his life to the church and his community. He had an unwavering faith and dedicated his life to serving others. He was canonized by Pope Urban in 1262. St. Richard Wyche is the patron saint of the County of Sussex, coachmen, laborers and the sick. His feast day is April 3rd

<u>Prayer:</u> Dear St. Richard Wyche, please help me to remember to put others before myself and to always be kind to everyone. Amen.

Person in the Cemetery with a similar name: Richard Jochman, was a member of the St. John's Parish and my grandfather. He was born in Kansas, but became a professor of chemistry at St. John's University. He had a way of helping students to understand the complexity of chemistry. He taught me to be grateful for things even in the darkest of days.
