

#### STAFF SHARING FR. BRADLEY JENNIGES, OSB

Recently I've been sensing that we are in a situation somewhat what was looming over us five years ago. Back then I heard a few people talking about having to deal with the impact of a new coronavirus that was starting to spread around the world. Many of us were not expecting the great changes that would happen in a very short time over the weeks that followed.

Over the past month, the Trump administration has been moving quickly to implement the policies that Trump intended to make upon assuming the presidency. There may be higher tariffs and potential counter-measures by other nations that could have a big effect on the price or availability of things we buy. Many federal employees may be fired in order to reduce the cost of government. Perhaps many nonprofit institutions will be affected by reductions in federal grants. We may go through upheaval as the effects of these changes work their way through society. Some people will face severe pain as they deal with loss of a job and difficulty in finding similar work in government or the non-profit sector or in private business. Others may be stymied by higher prices or shortages. Some people may prosper from the effects of these changes. People may turn more to their families for help to get through and move forward when there are few other places to turn.

We may be entering a time that will ask who we are as parish communities and as a diocese. People may come to the church seeking help dealing with economic and mental distress. People will look for signs of hope in a time when the way through current difficulties is hidden. Many will seek a solid Truth to trust during times of rapid and ongoing change and a babble of conflicting voices. In this Jubilee Year of Hope, how can our Area Catholic Community be a community where people find hope?

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

7<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel is filled with many challenges. Jesus says to the disciples: "...love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." These challenges go against what is more natural for us to do. We are called to see these situations with the eyes of Jesus and act from a spiritual level. "Be merciful just as your Father is merciful." "Stop judging and you will not be judges...Forgive and you will be forgiven." It is easy for us to stand in judgment of others, but Jesus asks us to trust God and others. Try to see the good in others and treat them as Jesus would treat them. Remember the saying: "What would Jesus do?" This can be a guide for us in our relationships with others. The question makes us stop and think before we react to those who do wrong to us. This week let this question; "what would Jesus do?", be your guide in dealing with those in your family and in your community.


## **ACC/AREA EVENTS & ANNOUNCEMENTS**

#### -Sesquicentennial Saint:

St. Walter Pontoise: He was a professor of philosophy before becoming a Benedictine monk. He was appointed the first abbot of a new monastery in Pontoise, France. He wanted to live a life of solitude and asked Pope Gregory VII to be released from his leadership position. He was told to use his God-given gifts to help others. Eventually, he established a monastery for women in honor of Mary, the Mother of God. St. Walter Pontoise is the patron saint of prisoners and prisoners of war. His feast day is April 8th. <a href="Prayer: Dear St.">Prayer: Dear St. Walter Pontoise, we ask for your guidance and protection. May your wisdom and holiness guide us as we seek to grow in our faith and to serve others. Amen.</a>

Person in the Cemetery with a similar name: Walter Goerger, was a member of the St. John's Parish and father of parishioners Mary Reischl, Annie Hanson, Dan Goerger, and Tess Koltes. He received his elementary education from his father, Philip Goerger, who was a school teacher. The foundation of the school can be found near I-94. Walter decided to be a dairy farmer. In his spare time he liked spending time in the woods, fishing, or playing 500 and cribbage. He was on the Building Committee which helped plan the construction of the Parish Center. His name, and others on the committee, can be found on the lower right side of the stained glass window in the large hall.
